Special General Meeting 24th of June

The U3A Tawa midyear Special General Meeting was held on Monday June 24th attended by 49 members.

The Constitution was discussed, and it was explained that new legislation required us to update our existing Constitution.

A tool for writing a suitable constitution, including some compulsory paragraphs, had been provided by MBIE, a Government Department. This had been worked on by a small Committee led by Alison Bayley and included David Wratt, Marie Prescott and Marian Hobbs. In April a meeting, open to all members, had been held to discuss the draft.

Dave Smith had submitted several amendments, and these were either agreed to, rejected or amended further. Dave was unable to attend the meeting. The Secretary subsequently contacted him with the results of his proposed amendments.

As a result, the draft Constitution, as amended, was ratified by the meeting and submitted to MBIE. This was carried by a large show of hands.

On further business Alison Bayley had indicated at the AGM that she would like to stand down from the position of U3A Chairperson and Alison nominated Marian Hobbs as the replacement Chairperson. There were no other nominations, and Marian's nomination was approved by a show of hands.

Alison was thanked for her sterling work as Chairperson over the last 5 years, noting in particular her leadership on the renewal of the Constitution. This was strongly acclaimed by the meeting.

Pat Hammond also indicated that she would be stepping down as Course Co-ordinator at the end of the year so a replacement would need to be found.

Course Co-ordinator Role

The role of the upcoming vacancy of the Course Co-ordinator consists of organising courses for the year and compiling the course booklets and mid-year inserts. This involves contacting all coordinators twice a year to confirm whether the course will be continuing in the following semester, and to arrange for any changes to the website, e.g. times and/or venues. The Co-ordinator also needs to set up any new courses.

Currently the Course Coordinator also books the venues for courses and designs the power point showing upcoming courses, but this could be done by one or two other people.

So, the U3A Committee invites Members to put their name forward to pick up this important role at the end of the year. As explained it could potentially be a shared role.
