Recent Day Trip:

On Thursday 11 April 19 members went on a fascinating tour of the Institute of Environmental Research and Science in Kenepuru (ESR). Leaders of their scientific teams told us about the Institute's many roles and we visited laboratories where we were told about the work of ESR's huge team of scientists across New Zealand. We saw an array of complex equipment, even watching one forensic scientist as she painstakingly examined a bag obviously associated with a Police investigation. As we heard about ESR's work across the fields of public health, drug safety,



environmental monitoring and infectious diseases we came to realise the breadth and complexity of its responsibilities and activities. We were very grateful to ESR for arranging this tour, and we all went away with a better appreciation for the expertise and dedication of our scientific community, and an understanding of how ESR's work relates to so many areas of our everyday life.

DRAFT PORIRUA U3A HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY FOR CONSULTATION WITH MEMBERS

Porirua U3A recognises its obligation to keep members safe when they are taking part in our activities. The following guidelines are designed to meet that objective.

Driving members to or from U3A activities: All drivers should hold a full current licence and their vehicle must hold a current WOF and registration. They should drive with care and consideration for their passengers.

Hosting meetings or other activities at your home Members hosting meetings or other U3A activities must ensure access to their home is safe and should mitigate hazards in their homes as far as possible. Members may decline to host visitors whose attendance may be unsafe for themselves, the host or others. Examples of such situations are where a visiting member may pass on an illness to others, or where that member has a physical limitation which poses a safety risk to themselves or others. Hosts must make sure visiting members know how to leave their home in an emergency.

U3A activities at a church, hall or other venue: the organiser must advise all members of the health and safety requirements pertaining to the venue. The organiser must advise all members of the health and safety requirements pertaining to the venue.
